Proposed Action or Project Description:

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act:

Funding will support laboratory and bench-scale research and development on a novel Hydrogen-Bromine Flow Battery technology for widespread use in grid-scale energy storage applications. The proposed work is consistent with the goal of GRIDS: development of new technologies to enable the widespread deployment of cost-effective, grid-scale energy storage.

Proposed work consists entirely of RD&D work to be completed in LBNL's laboratory in Berkeley, CA; Bosch's Facilities in Palo Alto, CA and Cambridge, MA; 3M Corporation's Laboratory in St. Paul, MN; and DuPont's Laboratory in Wilmington, DE. All work to be performed will be limited to in-lab design, fabrication, analysis, and development.


