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Proposed Action Title: University of Michigan -- Overcoming the Technical Challenges of Coordinating Distributed Load Resources at Scale

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Berkeley, CA; Ann Arbor, MI; Los Alamos, NM; Austin, TX

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale research and development activities to develop network-aware, communication-constrained, and non-disruptive control strategies for thermostatically controlled loads (TCLs), such as air conditioners, refrigerators, and electric water heaters. Specifically, the project team will (1) identify likely network, stability, and communication issues when operating at scale; (2) develop control strategies that overcome the issues; (3) analyze the cost vs. performance trade-off of different strategies; and (4) field test and validate the most promising strategies. If successful, the team will develop control strategies with stability guarantees that achieve the performance requirements of typical balancing services at a sufficiently low cost to enable the load aggregator and customer to profit.

Project activities will be conducted at a existing facilities at the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor, MI), Los Alamos National Laboratory (Los Alamos, NM), Pecan Street, Inc. (Austin, TX); and University of California at Berkeley (Berkeley, CA) designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to the existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.


To fit within the classes of actions listed in 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B, a proposal must be one that would not: (1) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, or similar requirements of DOE or Executive Orders; (2) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities (including incinerators), but the proposal may include categorically excluded waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment actions or facilities; (3) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or CERCLA-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that preexist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases; (4) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, including, but not limited to, those listed in paragraph B(4) of 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B; (5) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements, such as those listed in paragraph B(5) of 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
