Proposed Action Title: Otherlab - Adaptive Fluidic Solar Collectors

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): San Francisco, CA; Davis, CA

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale, research and development activities to create a new kind of solar tracker that dramatically reduces up front and ongoing maintenance costs compared to the state of the art and reduces the size of mirrors used to gather light in a heliostat field. For this next phase of the effort, the project team will focus on the tracker and field design and testing. Specifically, the project team intends to (1) move to the next stage of component reliability testing and advanced accelerated testing of components; (2) develop of a control platform exploring the capabilities for wind and leak detection; (3) work on novel field-level design including new installation techniques and architecture optimization; and 4) deploy, test, and performance monitor tracked systems in an outdoor location. If successful, the smaller mirrors will lower heliostat costs by up to 70%.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities that are designed for the applicable activities, and will be conducted in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and local safety and environmental requirements.

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support Otherlab's attempt at reducing the size of mirrors used to gather light in a heliostat field. If successful, the smaller mirrors will lower heliostat costs by 70%. Project tasks involve small-scale research and development activities at Otherlab's dedicated laboratory facility in San Francisco, CA and DNV GL's outdoor test field in Davis, CA. Project work will be performed by trained personnel and comply with applicable federal, state, and local requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support efforts to develop a novel heliostat array for a concentrated solar power plant that utilizes adaptive fluidic actuators, a multiplexing control system and dense heliostat layout. Project tasks will be conducted on a small-scale, pilot basis in dedicated laboratory, testing, and office facilities at the headquarters of Otherlab LLC.
